D., 1812, that her said husband Robert Waines volunteered at Blount County Ohio on or about the 27 day of July, A. D., 1813 for the term of thirty days and continued in actual service in said war for the term of fifteen days and was honorably discharged at Upper Sandusky on the 13 day of August, A. D., 1813 She further states that she was married to the said Robert Waines in Hamilton County Ohio on the 25 day of July, A. D., 1815, by one J. L. Wilson a M. C. and that her name before her said marriage was Catherine Truemp and that her said husband died at New Richmond Blount County, O. on the 5 day of May A. D., 1844, and that she is now a widow. She further declares that she has heretofore made application for Bounty Land under the "Act of September 28th, 1850," and ~~obtained~~ but obtained ~~no~~ no warrant ~~legally dispensed of~~ it cannot now be ret She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which she may be entitled under Act approved March 3d, 1855.

William Henry~~ in the war with Great Britain - that he volunteered at New Richmond on or about the month of July 1813 for the term of thirty days and continued in actual service for in said war for the term of 15 days and was honorably discharged at Upper Sandusky on or about the month of August A.D. 1813 as will appear by the muster rolls of said company - that she intermarried with the said Robert Haines, on or about the 25 day of July 1815 and that her said husband Robert Haines died on the 5 day of May 1844 and that she has remained a widow ever since - that neither her said husband nor herself have ever received any warrant for said service nor any other service to her knowledge - though she had applied under the act of Sept. 28, 1850
